
#### **Manchias**

We are happy to announce that mom and her five pups are happy, healthy, and currently being pampered in a foster home.



### Darla

Little Darla came to us with a multitude of injuries after getting struck by a car. After a few months of rehabilitation in her foster home, Darla is well on her way to making a full recovery. We hope to find her a forever family soon!

Foster homes are absolutely essential to caring for injured dogs like Darla. Darla and other severely wounded animals need extra time and attention to recover from injuries. It is much harder to provide that level of care in a shelter than it is in a foster home setting.

# **Support Our Summer Supply Drive**

In 2022, we have seen an unprecedented number of animals come through our doors. At this time last year, we had taken in 2.600 animals. This year, we've already surpassed 6,500 - a 150 percent increase in animal intakes! Furthermore. the rapid rise in supply cost means we're paying 20-50 percent more for the use of everyday supplies to feed animals and clean the kennels. We've exceeded our projected supply budget to date and the influx of animals continues at a rapid pace.

At any given time, there are 100+ animals in our care. As you can imagine, our washer, dryer, and dishwasher are running 24/7 to make sure our animals are eating and drinking from clean bowls and sleeping on fresh towels and blankets.

To help keep up with the increased volume of animals and the cost of their day-to-day care supplies, we are calling on our community to help us reach our goal of raising \$20,000 by the end of August through this Summer Supply Drive.





# What Can Your Dollar Do for YHS?

Here is a breakdown of what different gifts to the Summer Supply Drive do for YHS:

#### \$5,000 - Feed the 100+ animals at the shelter for one month

\$2,500 - Feed all the animals at the shelter for two weeks

\$1,000 - Feed all the dogs at the shelter for one week

\$500 - Feed all the cats and kittens at the shelter for one week

**\$250** - Provide all food, laundry detergent, and dish soap for one day

\$100 - Provide laundry detergent for one week

\$50 - Provide dish soap for one week


# Fur Ball 2022 was the Cat's Meow!

Our second annual **Hops for Hounds campaign** wrapped up in August and we are so excited about the progress we made in year two. Hops for Hounds was created not only as a fundraiser for YHS but to also bring our community together around one of our favorite commonalities, amazing local beer provided by the many local brewers here in the Yakima Valley.

With hops donated from Yakima Valley Hops and John I. Haas, along with malt donated from Cold Stream Malt and Grain Co. and Linc Malt, ten different breweries participated in this campaign -Varietal, John I. Haas, Hop Capital, Valley Brewing, 5th Line, Cowiche Creek, Single Hill, Shorthead Brewing, Wandering Hop, and Bale Breaker. With proceeds from the campaign sales and funds raised at the two parties we threw over the summer, we were **able to raise over \$10,000 for the animals in our care!**
